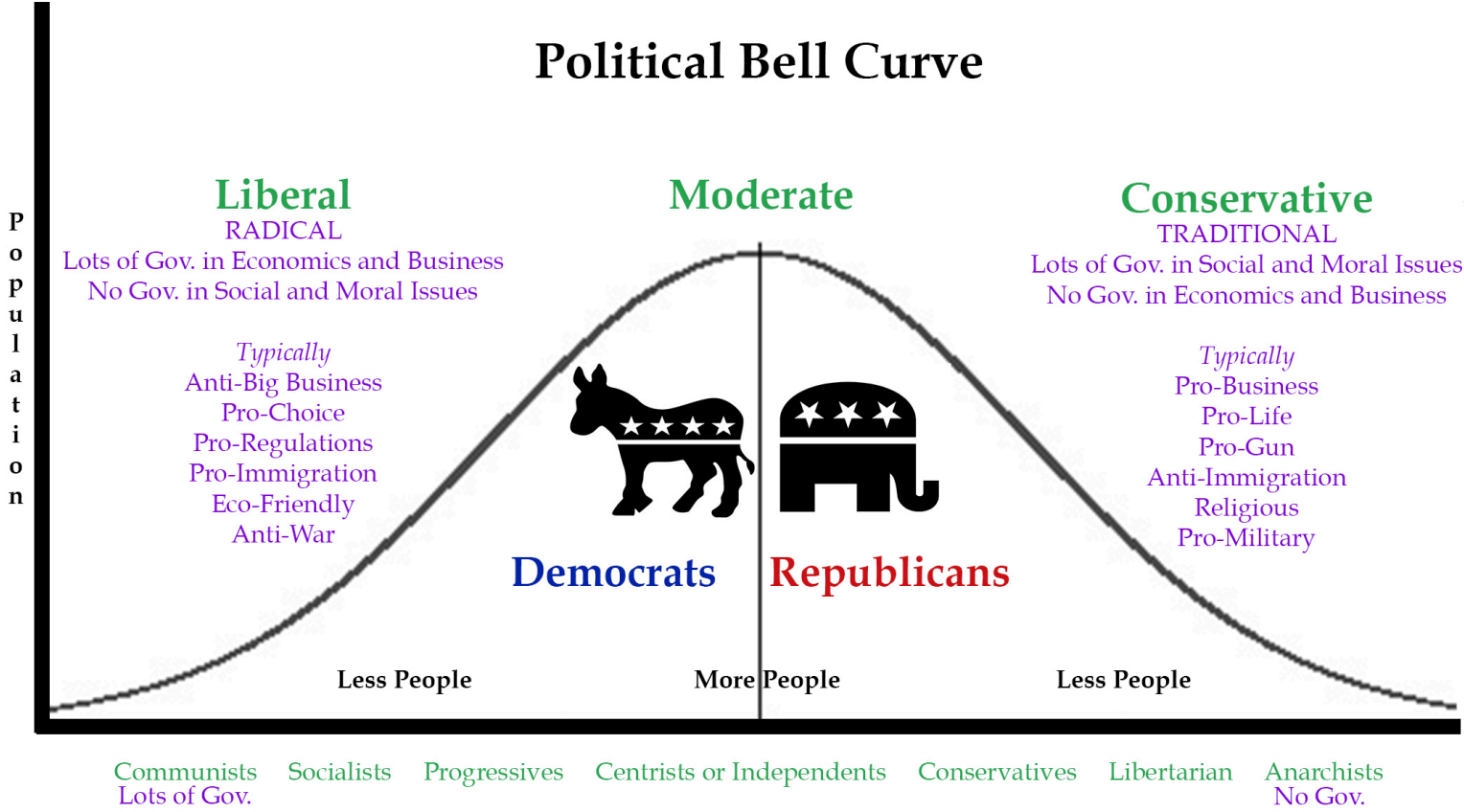
- ✓ Make sure to staple the document and the index cards here.
